

Board of Health Press Release - 4/16/2020

In the days to follow, the Stoneham Board of Health will be putting forward new information and guidelines for multi-unit apartment and condominium complexes regarding proper visitation and sanitizing procedures. With reports being received involving congregation and improper social distancing, more strict guidelines must be provided. All residents are asked to continue their efforts in maintaining distance from one another. The state-wide face-cover advisory remains in effect for the foreseeable future. Please be sure to utilize masks and cloth face coverings when in occupied public spaces and buildings.

On Friday, April 17, 2020 AFC Urgent Care in Stoneham, MA (located at 16 Main Street in Stoneham) will hold a COVID-19 drive through testing clinic from 9am to 3pm for members and residents of Stoneham and the surrounding communities who qualify for novel coronavirus testing.

In order to qualify for testing, patients will need to be pre-screened by an AFC provider on Tuesday, April 14th, Wednesday, April 15th or Thursday, April 16th via a telemedicine urgent care visit. Upon completion of the telehealth screening and determination of qualification for testing, AFC Urgent Care will send a personalized doctor's order to that specific patient in order to be tested on Friday, April 17th.

PLEASE NOTE: If a prospective patient does not bring an AFC doctor's note to the drive through testing clinic, that patient will not be eligible for testing.
